The Crigler Program provides a unique opportunity for students to explore academic excellence combined with leadership and social consciousness development.

This longstanding program is achieved through a combination of coursework, skill reinforcement, and orientation to life at a residential college. The program begins with a three-week virtual experience in July 2020 and continues through the Fall and Spring semesters.

During the summer experience, students participate in workshops and are enrolled in a four-credit course taught by Ursinus Faculty. In the Fall and Spring semesters Crigler students participate in weekly study sessions, monthly seminars and mentoring with peers and staff.

Frequently Asked Questions F.A.Q.s

Is there a cost to participate?

The Crigler Program is free of charge. In fact, the college provides a \$1200 stipend for every student who successfully completes the program. It is important to note that if you do not fully participate in the program or do not follow the policies outlined in the Student Handbook, you risk losing your stipend. Stipends are tax applicable.

Will meals be provided?

A meal stipend to defer the cost of food in the amount of \$50 during the three-week summer experience is provided by the Institute for Inclusion and Equity (IIE).

Will I receive any credit?

Yes! You will be enrolled in a 4-credit course. In addition to this course, students will take a 1-credit practicum in the Fall. Full participation is required.

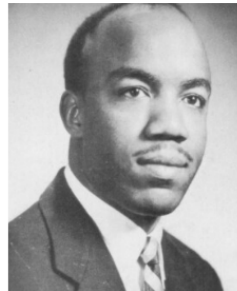
Will I need books for the classes that I take during the program?
