UPDATED INDIRECT COST RATES

Ursinus College has been issued new Facilities and Administrative Rate Agreement. Any grant proposal with a start date on or after July 1, 2021 should use the updated indirect cost rates. The new federally negotiated rates are as follows:

- · 43% of fringe, salaries, and wages on campus
- 43% of fringe, salaries, and wages of campus
 20% of fringe, salaries, and wages off campus

The Facilities and Administrative Rate Agreement (F&A Rate), often referred to as Indirect Costs, is the process of recovering the portion of costs that support externally funded projects. The F&A rate is negotiated between Ursinus College and the Department of Health and Human Services Cost Allocation Services. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DEADLINES

Deadlines for small research grants and summer supplies/support grants will be March 15. Small research grants defray costs related to publication or dissemination of work, and may not be used for travel in Spring 2021. The Pearlstine grant deadline will be April 1. This year, the committee will prioritize support for projects with evidence of approaching completion, as well as launch funding for projects in their initial phases. OUTDOOR CLASSROOMS

The college has reserved tents for use as outdoor classrooms beginning in mid/late March. This includes two large (40 x 40) tents to accommodate larger classes (up to 25.)

FACULTY GOOD NEWS

- Dr. Doron Taussig has published a book through the Cornell University Press. The
 book is entitled "What We Mean by the American Dream" and Is available for purchase
 through the Cornell University Press. Please stay tuned for an under-the-hood talk, in
 which a student and faculty will interview Doron about his new project.
- Dr. Cathy van de Ruit has received the Project Pericles grant for a new course. This
 grant will allow her to adapt the community health class to focus on service learning in
 the context of COVID-19. The class will enable students to gain first-hand insight into
 how social injustice and racial discrimination exacerbates COVID-19 transmission,
 morbidity, and mortality.
- Dr. Meghan Brodie participated in a remote presentation in July 2020 entitled "The Art of Empathy: 1 Living Newspaper radio Play Written by 9 Students in 6 States over 5 Weeks during the COVID-19 Pandemic." In this plenary session, Dr. Brodie discussed her theater capstone course on the Federal Theatre Project's living newspapers. Nine students collaborated on this project when COVID-19 hit and classes were moved online and drew from skills learned in their undergraduate career in theatre to portray the relationship between embodiment, empathy, and art. Dr. Brodie also published a personal essay entitled "Directing Performances of Germaine Tillion's In the Underworld: A Personal Essay." The essay was published by the Israeli performing arts journal Bamah after translating it into Hebrew. Along with the essay came an array of photos from Dr. Brodie's 2014 English-language world premiere of "In the Underworld," a darkly comic operetta written by Germaine Tillion while in the Ravensbruck concentration camp during World War II.
