

Room and Board Credit Adjustments Due to Covid-19 Only Fall 2022 and Spring 2023

The methodology for calculating the fall 2022 and spring 2023 room and board adjustment amounts for a large-scale closure is a combination of room and board charge minus the *average discount* provided by College-funded financial aid across all students, which is 50%. It is important to understand that nearly all students receive College-funded financial aid that reduces the *average out-of-pocket amount* by 50%. This methodology does not include state, federal, or other outside forms of financial aid.

Any student who receives zero institutional financial aid will get a 100% pro-rated room and board adjustment based on the total number of complete weeks not in residency. All others will receive \$244 per complete week not in residency. Each new, complete billing week starts Sunday at 12am.

Actual move-in dates supplied by Residence Life will be used to determine total weeks in residence for all returning students to define how many weeks adjustment is made.

Please note that the [separation policy](#) will continue and be enforced for all situations not related to the COVID-19 pandemic should a student choose to leave the residence hall at any point during the semester. Requests for special consideration for COVID-19 related circumstances will be reviewed by the Office of Student Financial Services. Adjustments are not guaranteed in these instances. Medical documentation may be required.

Important: Per mandated federal regulations, any changes in or reductions to room and board charges would require a reduction to the total cost of attendance. Please note that your financial aid package may change to remain within and/or proportional to the new cost of attendance; this may result in a decrease/change to financial aid, including but not limited to: institutional, federal and private aid.

Potential Scenarios

Student is mandated to leave the residence halls because of COVID-19: If a student is required to leave the college, as mandated by the College for health and safety reasons due to COVID-19, they will receive a room and board adjustment for \$244 per week for the number of complete weeks not in residency. Confirmed move-in and move-out dates will be used to assess the total number of weeks not in residency. This does not apply if a student is placed in isolation/quarantine in college residence halls.

Student chooses to leave the residence halls during the semester: If a student chooses to leave the residence halls at any point in the semester and is not required to do so by the institution for reasons related to COVID-19, the college's published separation policy will be enforced.

Student tests positive for COVID-19 and is moved into isolation/quarantine housing by the college: No room and board adjustment will be given.

Student is separated from the residence halls or College during the semester for not following College's COVID-19 mandated guidelines or the Code of Conduct: While the college will be in residence and is planning for a full residential experience for the 2022-2023 academic year, the COVID-19 situation may change, requiring a return to COVID-19 mandated student guidelines. In the unlikely event this should occur, and if a student is separated from the residence halls or college at any point in the semester due to violations to COVID-19 mandated guidelines or the Code of Conduct, the college's published separation policy will be enforced.
